## Dutch-flavoured, CARIBBEAN COOL

THE CARIBBEAN is a place you always thought you knew - and then there's Curaçao, a surprise taste of European-chic off the coast of Venezuela. With a multicultural heritage that includes Dutch, Spanish and Portuguese, the island oozes European charm, architecture and influence. This cosmopolitan perspective is then wrapped in an icing of warm island hospitality - all of which suits its many visitors from the Netherlands perfectly.

There are a number of nooks and crannies here to anchor your big day away. Rather than a few long stretches of beach, Curaçao has 35 small beaches, each with its own character. You just have to find the one that suits you best. With watersports for the adventurer, a celebrated culinary scene for the foodie, a café society for the night owl, and a treasured link to the past for the history buff, Curaçao truly has something for everyone. The fact that the island is outside the hurricane belt is another selling point, particularly when you have a wedding to plan.

Couples opting for opulence book in at Santa Barbara Beach \& Golf Resort, with cus-tom-designed packages for five guests or 500 . You can choose from the white-sand beach, an oceanside pavilion, expansive terraces, even a helipad. The resort also serves up several pools, tennis courts, a full-service spa and

one of the best golf courses in the Caribbean. Intimate ceremonies at Baoase Luxury Resort can be held in a stunning private villa or on tiny Bibi Island directly in front of the resort, which offers palm-tree perfection and a stellar sunset.

The Euro-tinged island cuisine yields succulent snapper, the freshest tuna and exquisite ceviche via seemingly endless and inventive fusion.
Back to your checklist, the steps to tying the knot in Curaçao are not complicated. Once the paperwork is arranged with the registry office and your witnesses are lined up, all you have to do is show up and enjoy yourself.
